#### **CREATIVE WRITING**

Each meeting is primarily devoted to the work of the group members, giving them ample time to discuss their pieces and gain valuable feedback. If time allows, the group takes part in exercises aimed at developing and enhancing a particular writing skill. Last month we examined the first paragraphs of several short stories to glean what information was subtly conveyed to the reader - the who, what, when, where and how—but also the mood, atmosphere and possible themes—of the pieces. We then had a go at writing our own first paragraph during the Zoom meeting. Afterwards, we read them aloud to the group and discussed them.

During the December and January meetings we will be looking at how setting plays a role in describing characters, their emotions, and how it can advance the plot.

#### **EXPLORING THE SHORT STORY**

During December we will be reading a crime fiction short story, the first time we have explored this genre in the group. During the Victorian era it was not uncommon to tell or read aloud ghost stories during the festive Christmas season, with the haunting departed often meeting an untimely or gruesome end. Murder mysteries set at Christmas have remained in vogue ever since.

For January we will be re-reading and discussing a story from our backlog, an auld lang syne of past stories so to speak. This was chosen by the group from the list and it looks as if Margaret Atwood's 'Stone Mattress' is the winner so far.

Exploring the Short Story meets every second Wednesday of the month from half ten to half twelve via Zoom. Members are sent the Zoom link and short story to be discussed via email every month. At present the group is heavily subscribed and unfortunately not taking any new members.
