EXPLORING THE SHORT STORY

For our October Zoom meeting, we will be getting spooky for Halloween with Oscar Wilde's short story, 'The Canterville Ghost', one of the first of his stories to be published (1887). The short story has all the elements of a Gothic horror tale but used to humorous effect, including a ghost with a centuries-long tradition of haunting Canterville Chase, an English country home. The story begins with Lord Canterville selling his ancestral home (with a direct warning about the live-in ghost) to a wealthy American family who hold no truck with ghosts, despite the ghost's best and most dramatic efforts to convince them of his frightening existence.

The spooky (but comic) tale will be discussed via a Zoom link on Wednesday, 13 October, from 10.30 to 12.30. Present group members will be sent the link and the story by the beginning of October. New members are not presently being sought for this group as it is already fully subscribed.
